Second over third was again very close with second being more balanced and having more strength than 3rd.

The three old class not as strong overall as the other classes. The first place was a clear winner. A 3 year old with nice balance, great frame and very good udder. The second place was a difficult heifer to judge, very good frame just lacking a little in condition to show herself of to her best and unfortunately milked out which made appreciating her udder difficult. The third heifer just lacked in rear udder height and rear teat placement compared to the 2nd heifer but had a nicely balanced frame.

The class of the show, very even and of high standard, choosing the winner the most difficult decision of the show. The first two were different types of cow, one taller but not as stretchy as the other, who while shorter had great stretch. Both possessed great udders, very high and wide in the rear and well attached at the front with teats hanging straight. I finally went for the shorter cow as to me the overall balance and the way the udder blended onto the body gave her the edge. The third cow was similar to the second cow but the second heifer was better in the feet and legs having better heel depth and straighter in the leg.
